

What is Autism?

- Developmental disorder
- 1 in 150 births (Centers for Disease Control Prevention, 2007)
- Interfering with the normal developmental functioning of the brain in the areas of social interaction and communication skills such as verbal and non-verbal communication, social interactions, and leisure or play activities.
- it affects each individual differently and at varying degrees

What causes Autism?

Genetics

Heritability rates of 75%

 For most people with ASDs, the cause is not known.

Signs of Autism.

- Lack of responsiveness
- Communication impairment
- Bizarre responses to environment: Fixation on an object
- Insistence on routines
- Repetitive body movements
- Withdrawal from social contacts
- Delay in imaginative play
- No eye contact
